BACKGROUND / EXPLANATION OF IMPACT

Last year, through the annual budget process, the Board agreed to contribute up to \$50,000.00 towards the administration of the City of Bellingham's 2012 Lake Whatcom Invasive Species Program.

FISCAL IMPACT

Previously, the District agreed to contribute financial resources towards the reimbursement of the City's resources in the administration of their Aquatic Invasive Species Program at Lake Whatcom. Both the District and the City utilize Lake Whatcom as their primary drinking water source and have a joint and common interest in protecting the quality and safety of the environment associated with the Lake. The aquatic invasive species effort was initiated in fiscal year 2012. As reflected in the attached agreement, the City will continue to be the party responsible for administering the program.

Periodic written reports will be presented to the District by the City regarding requested reimbursement contributions. A renewal of this program agreement will come back to the Board at the beginning of each year so long as we are financially participating. Resources have been provided for in the 2013 Budget.

RECOMMENDED BOARD ACTION

To approve the 2013 version of the attached Interlocal Agreement with the City of Bellingham.

PROPOSED MOTION

To authorize the General Manager to sign the 2013 Interlocal Agreement between the City of Bellingham and the District in an amount not to exceed \$50,000.00 towards the funding of the Lake Whatcom Aquatic Invasive Species Program.

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

2013 CITY OF BELLINGHAM - LAKE WHATCOM WATER AND SEWER DISTRICT

LAKE WHATCOM AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES PREVENTION PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the City of Bellingham (City) and Lake Whatcom Water and Sewer District (District) have a mutual interest in protecting water resources in the Lake Whatcom Watershed; and

WHEREAS, Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) are capable of impacting water quality, recreational use and the aquatic ecology of Lake Whatcom; and

WHEREAS, watercraft are a widely recognized vector for movement and introduction of AIS within and between water bodies; and

WHEREAS, the risk of AIS introductions into Lake Whatcom can be reduced by education of watercraft users and inspection of watercraft prior to launching into Lake Whatcom; and

WHEREAS, the City and the District have committed resources to support establishment and operation of an AIS Prevention Program for Lake Whatcom; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement is authorized under the Washington State Interlocal Cooperation Act, Chapter 39.34 RCW;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF BELLINGHAM AND LAKE WHATCOM WATER AND SEWER DISTRICT AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. SCOPE OF WORK

Task 1 - Administration: The City will administer and manage the AIS Prevention Program, including hiring, training, outfitting, scheduling and supervision of program staff.

Task 2 - Reporting: Periodic reports of the program's status will be delivered to the District upon request.

2. TERM

- (a) This Agreement shall be effective March 15, 2013 and shall continue through December 31, 2013. The Agreement shall only be renewed, in writing, on terms then agreed to by the parties. The term shall be as stated in the agreement regardless of the date of signature.
- (b) This Agreement may be terminated for convenience by either party upon the giving of ninety (90) days written notice to the other party whereupon payment for time and effort expended up to and including the date of termination shall be paid in full.
- (c) This Agreement may be terminated for cause by either party after giving the defaulting party thirty (30) day's written notice of default and an opportunity to cure.

3. PAYMENT

- (a) The District shall reimburse the City for AIS prevention program costs, including but not limited to staff outfitting and wages. The maximum payable under this Agreement is \$50,000.
- (b) Payments to the City will be made monthly based on invoices submitted to the District. All payments hereunder are considered reimbursement for services rendered. Reimbursements hereunder shall not create an employment relationship between the District and any City staff, nor shall it confer any ownership or management rights in the District to any property or assets acquired by the City under the AIS prevention program.
- (c) The District shall promptly review and pay the invoice in accordance with its usual procedures.
- (d) A short program update shall accompany each invoice.

4. PERSONS RESPONSIBLE FOR ADMINISTRATION OF THE AGREEMENT

The City designates the Public Works Natural Resources Policy Manager, or his/her designee, as its person responsible for administration of the this Agreement. The District designates its General Manager, or his/her designee, as its person responsible for administration of this Agreement.

5. LEGAL RELATIONS

In performing the services outlined in this Agreement, neither party is acting as the agent or employee of the other; rather, each party is acting as an independent contractor.

6. DEFENSE, INDEMNIFICATION, HOLD HARMLESS

Each party shall defend, indemnify and hold the other harmless from and against any and all cost or liability for damage to persons or property arising from the negligent acts or omissions of itself or its elected officials, employees or agents in relation to this Agreement.

Clean, Drain, Dry

Your Boat and Recreational Equipment Help stop the spread of invasive species

D CLEAN

- Remove ALL aquatic plants, animals, and mud.
- Thoroughly wash everything, especially in crevices and hidden areas.

DRAIN

• Drain water from your boat, trailer, tackle and gear, including wells, bilge, and engine cooling water **before** leaving the area.

DRY

- Allow sufficient time for your boat and equipment to completely dry <u>before</u> entering other waters.
- If you cannot perform these steps, you should have your boat professionally cleaned with high-pressure hot water (>140°F) before launching into other waters.
- Do NOT release pets, bait, aquatic plants, or aquarium water into the wild.

Boating Rules

- Do not use carbureted two-stroke engines on Lake Whatcom
- Do not transport any plants or animals to or from Lake Whatcom
- Speed Limits:
 - o **6 mph at all times** if you are within 300 feet of docks and the shore, or within 100 feet of a swimmer, diver, or any non-motorized boat
 - o Night: 8 mph from 30 min after sunset to 30 min before sunrise
 - o Day: 40 mph in unrestricted areas 30 min before sunrise to 30 min after sunset
- Right-of-Way:
 - You must give way to swimmers, divers, and fallen skiers
 - You must give way to any non-motorized watercraft including: sailboats, rowboats, canoes, and kayaks
- Life jackets are required to be aboard for each passenger and must be worn by children under the age of 7 at all times.
- Age:
 - You must be at least 10 years old to operate a motorized watercraft up to 10 HP without an adult on board
 - o You must be 16 to operate a motorized watercraft with a motor greater than 10 HP
