REGARDING FUTURE WATER SERVICE

The District supplies both water and sanitary sewage disposal services to customers within its recognized service area under provisions of state law and specifically Title 57 of the Revised Code of Washington. The Owners are the record Owners of certain real estate located within the District's service area and more particularly described below ("the Property"). Owners are required by Whatcom County to obtain publicly owned and operated sewer service in order to build on their property. District policy requires that, as a condition of such service, customers agree to pay all required charges to obtain water service from the District when and if it becomes available in the future. The District does not presently have water service available to serve the Owners'

Property. Because the Owner's Property is capable of supporting a well or drawing water from Lake Whatcom, the District agrees to provide water service, when and if it becomes available to the parcel, subject to the terms and conditions of this agreement.

The Owners are willing to assume responsibility for fire protection and for operation and maintenance of their water system.

The District is not relinquishing any portion of its service area by entering into this agreement.

In view of the foregoing recitals and in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises set out below, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. In the event that in the future the District, in its sole discretion, determines that it has additional water infrastructure sufficient to serve the Property, the Owners agree to pay all required charges to connect to and obtain water service from the District and comply with all District policies regarding water conservation. The Owner shall be responsible for any requirements of Washington Department of Ecology or Whatcom County Health Department related to abandonment of the well or demolition of any facilities which temporarily serve the property.
- 2. The Owners waive their right and that of their heirs, successors and assigns to protest the formation by the District of a ULID for the provision of water service within the area where the Property is located, reserving, however, their rights to protest the amount of any proposed assessment under such ULID on the ground that the assessment is inequitable compared to that of the other comparable property within the ULID or that the amount of the assessment does not reflect the benefit received by the Property. However, in any such protest, the availability of well water or lake water shall not be considered. The Owners further waive any right to object to or protest the inclusion of the Property within the benefit area of a future developer extension reimbursement agreement which constructs facilities capable of providing water and/or sewer service to the Property.
- 3. This covenant shall bind and run with the Property described herein and shall inure to the benefit of the District and its successors and assigns.

The Owners desire to obtain water and sanitary sewer service from the District in the future. The District does not have current water or sewer service available to serve the Owners' Property. Because the unavailability of service is viewed as temporary, however, and because the Owner's Property is capable of supporting a well and a properly designed septic system, the District agrees to provide water service and/or sewer service to the Property in the future, when and if it has capacity, subject to the terms and conditions of this agreement.

The Owners are willing to assume responsibility for fire protection and for operation and maintenance of their water and septic systems.

The District is willing to agree to the installation of a septic tank sewage disposal system on the Property if the Owners agree to connect to the public sewer at such time as the District, in its sole discretion, determines that sewer capacity is available in the future.

The District is not relinquishing any portion of its service area by entering into this agreement.

In view of the foregoing recitals and in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises set out below, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. In the event that in the future the District, in its sole discretion, determines that it has additional water infrastructure sufficient to serve the Property, the Owners agree to connect to the District water system, pay all standard District fees and charges, and comply with all District policies regarding water conservation. The Owner shall be responsible for any requirements of Washington Department of Ecology or Whatcom County Health Department related to abandonment of the well or demolition of the facilities which are to temporarily serve the property.
- 2. At such time as the District, in its sole discretion, determines that sewer capacity or other infrastructure is available, the Owners agree to connect to the District's sanitary sewer system and to pay all standard District fees and charges applicable to the provisions of public sewer service to the Property, at the times and in the amounts applicable at the time of actual connection.

Lake Whatcom Water and Sewer District ULID #18 Utility Local Improvement District

A Utility Local Improvement District is a means of financing a needed public improvement by assessing properties that benefit from the improvement. In 2001, the Lake Whatcom Water and Sewer District Board of Commissioners formed ULID #18 to fund the Lake Louise Road Interceptor, which provides sewer service to the south shore of Lake Whatcom. The assessment amount was based upon the total cost of the Lake Louise Road Interceptor project divided by the number of anticipated hook ups. Each vacant property or home utilizing a septic system was assessed an equal amount of \$2,792.78 per assessment.

Billing for Installment Payments

- 1. ULID statements are billed annually on March 1st and are mailed to the owners of assessed properties carrying an open assessment balance until 2023.
- 2. ULID charges are billed at \$139.64 principal and 9.5% interest on the remaining unpaid balance of the assessment.
- 3. The due date for the minimum annual payment is April 30th of the year it is billed. A 30-day grace period is allowed.
- 4. If the minimum annual amount due is not paid by the due date, including the grace period, a past due fee of 12% will be assessed against the annual minimum amount due.

Some vacant properties located within the benefit area were excluded from the assessment roll for one of the following reasons:

- 1. The property had an existing prepaid sewer permit through a developer extension agreement.
- 2. The property cannot be developed as a result of deed restriction, binding covenant, lot line erasure, recorded conservation easement, or other legally binding restriction.
- 3. The property owner elected to "opt out" of ULID #18 by recording a Restrictive Covenant preventing the property from receiving sewer service for a period of 25 years.
- 4. The properties were owned by either Whatcom County or the District at the time that the ULID was formed.

<u>Transfer of Restrictive Covenants and Assessments</u>

Property owners who signed Restrictive Covenants to opt out of ULID #18 may transfer their Restrictive Covenants to other properties, provided that the assessment is paid in full. Please contact the District office for more information.

ULID #18 Latecomer Fees

An interest rate of 9.5% is charged over the life of the sewer interceptor financing period. Sewer service for properties that were not subject to assessment as a part of ULID #18 but are situated within the south shore service area pay a charge in lieu of the assessment (Latecomer Fee) when a sewer permit is issued. The Latecomer Fee is the equivalent of the original assessment plus interest.

ABOUT LAKE WHATCOM WATER AND SEWER DISTRICT

Water District No. 10 was formed in 1968 and provides water and sewer services to approximately 4,000 residential customers in the area encompassing Lake Whatcom. Residents of the City of Bellingham, Lake Whatcom Water and Sewer District, and many lakeside homeowners use Lake Whatcom for drinking water.

Lake Whatcom Water and Sewer District operates a water treatment plant that provides water to Sudden Valley and Geneva residents. The District also distributes water purchased from the City of Bellingham to its Eagleridge customers. All water distributed by Lake Whatcom Water and Sewer District meets or surpasses EPA Safe Drinking Water standards.

Sewage from the District is collected and pumped to the Bellingham secondary wastewater treatment plant at Post Point for treatment. The District does not treat its own sewage.

Lake Whatcom Water and Sewer is operated by 18 full time staff persons, a five member Board of Commissioners, and has an annual operations and maintenance budget of about \$4.4 million dollars.

DON'T FLUSH IT!

Some things should not be flushed down toilets or dumped down sink drains because they can clog or damage your pipes and the District's sewer system. Kitchen grease and oil, clay cat litter, feminine hygiene products, contraceptives, dental floss, candle wax and ground eggshells can all clog your pipes and cause problems further down the line.

When clogs occur, District field crews have to manually clean the sewer lines and/or pump stations, so razors and needles that end up in the sewer system can become a health hazard to them.

Petroleum products, solvents, oil based paint, and paint thinners can cause serious damage to pump station mechanics and should never be flushed or poured into the sewer.

TYPICAL SEWER LATERAL & CLEANOUT


